## **Did The Law End At The Cross**

What ended at the cross? The *Ten Commandments*, or the *sacrificial law*, or All the laws in the first five books of the Bible? This is a very controversial subject for the followers of Jesus. Then again there is no controversy, just handed down errors in understanding or people being self-righteous and refuse to hear or understand the truth.

### **The Interpretation of Daniel's Dream**

**Daniel 7:25 (NIV)** He will speak against the Most High and oppress his holy people and try to change the set times and the laws. The holy people will be delivered into his hands for a time, times and half a time.

### **Daniel 7:25 (KJV)**

<sup>25</sup> And he shall speak *great* words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of the most High, and think to change times and laws: and they shall be given into his hand until a time and times and the dividing of time.

I will read a few verses from the Bible that reflect that the law has never changed.

### **Matthew 5:17-20 (KJV)**

<sup>17</sup> Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil. <sup>18</sup> For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled. <sup>19</sup> Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments, and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and teach *them*, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

<sup>20</sup> For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed *the righteousness* of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven.

### **Matthew 7:21-24 (KJV)**

<sup>21</sup> Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.

<sup>22</sup> Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy

name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?

<sup>23</sup> And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

<sup>24</sup> Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock:

**Luke 16:17 (KJV)** And it is easier for heaven and earth to pass, than one tittle of the law to fail.

**Romans 2:13 (KJV)** <sup>13</sup> (For not the hearers of the law *are* just before God, but the doers of the law shall be justified.

**Romans 13:8-10 (KJV)** <sup>8</sup> Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law. <sup>9</sup> For this, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not kill, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Thou shalt not covet; and if *there be* any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. <sup>10</sup> Love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love *is* the fulfilling of the law.

**Romans 3:31 (KJV)** <sup>31</sup> Do we then make void the law through faith? God forbid: yea, we establish the law.

**Romans 7:12 (KJV)** <sup>12</sup> Wherefore the law *is* holy, and the commandment holy, and just, and good.

**1 John 2:3-4 (KJV)** <sup>3</sup> And hereby we do know that we know him, if we keep his commandments. <sup>4</sup> He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him.

**1 John 5:2-3 (KJV)** <sup>2</sup> By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God, and keep his commandments. <sup>3</sup> For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous.

**Revelation 12:17 (KJV)** <sup>17</sup> And the dragon was wroth with the woman, and went to make war with the remnant of her seed, which keep the commandments of God, and have the testimony of Jesus Christ.

**Revelation 22:14 (KJV)** <sup>14</sup> Blessed *are* they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city.

**MATTHEW 5:17-18 (NIV)** Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. **18** For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished.

**When will everything be accomplished? Revelations 19 – 20 – 21 -22 .....**
